

# Directions For Use

**PERENNIALS:** Use ½ cup of worm castings and work into the soil just above the root zone. Be careful around the roots not to damage them. Best times of use are Spring, Early Summer, Early Fall.

**ANNUALS:** Use in the bottom of plant holes before planting roughly 1 ½ inches deep. Use regular soil to position and set plant. Water as needed.

**VEGATABLES:** Use similar method as ANNUALS for plant sets. Some top dressing with worm castings can be helpful for water retention.

**VEGATABLE SEED STARTS:** Use worm castings to line the bottom of the tray. Place seeds on top of castings. Mix ½ top soil and ½ worm castings for cover.

**POTTED PLANTS:** For new plants start with 1/3 worm castings and 2/3 potting soil and mix together.

**ESTABLISHED POTTED PLANTS:** Cover the top of the plant soil with worm castings 1 ½ inch deep. Mix in the worm castings with the plant soil. \*\*Be careful not to damage any of the roots. Water in as needed.

**ROSE BUSHES:** Use 2-3 cups of worm castings into the soil just below the surface of each plant.

**NEW TREES & SHRUBS:** Mix 1 part worm casting and 3 parts potting soil. Spread mixture around the root system and cover. Water in as needed.

**CANNABIS:** Add a layer of worm castings around the plant prior to flowering. Also use as a base layer for early starts.

**WORM TEA:** Submerge bag of worm castings in 5 gallon bucket of water for 24 hrs. For best results aerate the water during submerge. A cheap aquarium pump works well. Apply worm tea to plants with a sprayer.
